Daniel Lazzaretto is an 18 year old from Pasadena who just graduated from Marshall Fundamental. Indoctrinated early on, he started taking private piano lessons at age 7. After picking up alto saxophone in 4th grade, he continued his interest with lessons at PCM with Kirsten Edkins in 6th grade. He has been a member of the Marshall Jazz Band and Marching Band beginning in middle school, and has been a pit instrumentalist for the Marshall Drama productions of "Matilda", "Newsies" and "The Prom". He was also a member of the pit for the PUSD All-Star Musical Production of "Into the Woods". Daniel was awarded the prestigious Louis Armstrong Award in May 2023; the highest-level interscholastic jazz award given to students at high schools in the United States. He currently takes lessons from Danny Janklow for saxophone and flute, and also plays piano, clarinet, and percussion.
