He has been studying violin with Sharon Harman at the Pasadena Conservatory of Music since 2014. Max has been a violinist with Pasadena Youth Symphony Orchestra for the past three years, culminating in Assistant Principal Second Violin of the Philharmonic and performing at Carnegie Hall in the summer of 2022. At Flintridge Prep, Max co-chaired the newly formed Performing Arts Committee and led a music service club called Healing Harmonies that played monthly concerts at local senior communities. Max extended his music education, attending programs such as the Idyllwild Arts Academy Chamber and Orchestra Intensive, Berklee College of Music Film and Video Game Scoring Program, and the Carnegie Mellon School of Music PreCollege Program. Max is very excited to be heading to Boston this fall to begin his college career at Northeastern University where he will pursue a degree in International Affairs and History, with a minor in Music. He plans to pursue his love of music participating in the Northeastern University Orchestra, playing in a chamber group, and taking private lessons at the New England Conservatory.
